

Minutes of the meeting of the State Level Vigilance and Monitoring Committee held under the Chairmanship of Pu R.Lalzirliana, Hon'ble Minister, Rural Development Department at the New Secretariat Conference hall, khatla at 11 :00 am on 25.04.17.

The meeting was chaired by Pu R.Lalzirliana, Hon'ble Minister, Rural Development Department. At the outset, the Chairman welcomed the members and a discourse was held at length on the Action Taken Report of the previous meeting held on 1.12.2016. It was reported by Rural Development Department that all pending allocation highlighted during the previous meeting has been cleared by Finance Department. The Social Welfare Department reported that on the issue of Delegation of Financial powers to enable the Department to sanction assistance to the beneficiaries, it has submitted a proposal to the State Finance Department. Representative of Finance Department informed the meeting that necessary Financial powers would be delegated in the current F/Y i.e 2017-18 .The Project Directors, DRDAs reported that under PMKSY/IWMP, efforts were made in designating the BDOs as PIAs. Nevertheless, for those projects which are on the verge of closure, re-designating the BDOs as PIAs was considered unnecessary. It was evinced that under NRDWP concurrence for backlog of State Matching Share may be accorded by the State Finance Department. On the issue of setting up of Society under BADP, it was reported that the Administrative Department has received the proposal for setting up a Society and with its observation Administrative Approval will be conveyed. The various schemes (CSS) were taken up for discussion/review as follows:

1. National Rural Drinking Water Programme(NRDWP) :

It was reported that under NRWDP for the F/Y, 2016-17, under Partially Covered schools have been covered and the Partially Covered (5-10 lts) will be converted to Fully Covered (55 lts).

2. Nirmal Bharat Abhiyan/ Swaach Bharat Mission(NBA/ SBM) :

It was iterated that the figure in the report under IHHL construction (APL), the total should be reduced to 634 from 831 as Serchhip District has NIL construction and the District could be declared as Open Defecation Free. It was reported that under Swaach Bharat Mission, construction of toilets in Schools

and Anganwadi is no longer taken up by PHE Department but by the concerned Department. Hence, NIL report is projected under the said institution.

3. Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS):

Under MGNREGA, it was reported that during the last F/Y 2016-17, Rs 144.5126 crores was received as Central Share which was utilized for generating 35 days of wage employment. It was also iterated that the spillover from the previous F/Y 2015-16, amounting to Rs 60 crores was utilized during the F/Y 2016-17, for which 14 days wage employment was generated. The performance of the State despite being stellar, it was evinced that it does not result in the eventual increase in allocation of fund by the Ministry leading the State to resort to submitting representation to the Ministry many a times. It was also mentioned that as 1st tranche of 1st installment an amount of Rs 134 crores have been received which will result in the generation of 31 days wage employment which is a welcome gesture for the State in terms of fund allocation which is based on the Labour Budget thus prepared.

It was reported that from the current F/Y 2017-18, wage payment will be made via e-FMS while Material and Admin. cost through Bank transfer in the nascent stage of its implementation.

4. Indira Awaaz Yojana (IAY) / Pradhan Mantri Awaaz Yojana (PMAY):

It was reported that funds under PMAY (2016-17) was lying unutilized on account of issue of beneficiary selection as the new guidelines has called for selection of beneficiaries based on SECC 2011 data. The point of contention being the selected beneficiaries identified through the Gram Sabha do not match the Auto Generated List (Awaasoft) arrived from SECC 2011 data. The conformity of Permanent Wait List to the Auto-generated List is only 2-3%. It was expressed that, since, SECC 2011 data being the root cause of the ambiguity, the General Administration Department being the Nodal Department for preparation of SECC 2011, the Rural Development Department has written a representation to General Administration Department citing the irrelevance of SECC 2011 data and to take up the issue with the Government of India to seek exemption in using the SECC 2011 Data as the basis of identification of beneficiaries under various social benefit schemes as well as in re-exercising the SECC enumeration, in the interest of the rustic masses living in abject poverty. Nevertheless, it was iterated that instruction was issued to all Block Development Officers to identify the beneficiaries via-à-vis the Auto Generated list.

It was also decided that the backlog in State Matching Share against the Central Release i.e 2nd installment 2015-16, may be accorded by Finance Department

Action : Rural Development Deptt, General Admn. Deptt & Finance Deptt.

5. PradhanMantri Gram SadakYojana :

The financial progress during the F/Y 2016-17 was reported i.e total availability of fund was Rs 13150.11 lakhs where the Central allocation was Rs 9286.25 lakhs and the State Government has correspondingly sanction Rs 1472.20 lakhs. It was reported that under PMGSY the Detailed Project Report (DPR) was prepared in eight phases commencing from 2001. Out of the sanctioned project, there are 25 on-going projects. Under PMGSY, during the reporting period 56 Nos of New works has been taken up. It was iterated that Hmunpui road under PMGSY has developed cracks and pot holes and has not lasted even a year. Hence, it was re-emphasized that quality and durability should be maintained as far as possible since the PMGSY roads are the lifeline of the rustic masses living in far flung corner of the State.

Action : Public Works Department.

6. National Social Assistance Programme(NSAP) :

It was reported that NSAP is comprised of three components namely IGNOPAS, IGNWPS & IGNDPS. It was highlighted that Social Welfare Department also faced the same issue of beneficiary identification as selection is based on SECC 2011 data where the deserving beneficiaries have to be left out as they are not part of the SECC 2011 data.

7. Mizoram State Rural Livelihood Mission (MzSRLM):

It was reported that under SRLM, besides Lunglei and Aizawl District, the Mission has commenced in all the Districts covering 10 Rural Development Blocks with 1841 functional Self Help Groups with an accumulated savings of approximately Rs 2 crores. During the F/Y 2017-18, new entry of the Mission will be made in seven Rural Development Blocks. The main issue in the implementation of the scheme is the paucity of loans being handed out to the Self Help Group where emphasis is not given by the Banks on poverty schemes. Hence, the issue has to be intimated to the Lead Bank Manager

Action: CEO, MzSRLM.

8. Integrated Watershed Management Programme(IWMP)/PMKSY:

Under IWMP/PMKSY the meeting was informed that 89 projects are being undertaken in 6 Batches. All projects taken up during F/Y 2009-10 has been closed and there are 5 Batches covering 73 projects undertaken in 249 villages with coverage area of 311480 hectares. It was reported that during the F/Y 2016-17, there is total fund availability of Rs 2987.06 lakhs for which 95.88 % of the fund has been expended. The overall increase in income and employment generated by the programme is noteworthy and is worth an emulation by other similar schemes.

9. District Rural Development Agency Admin.(DRDA) :

Under DRDA Admn. the mode of staff positioning was discussed. The meeting was informed that the discrepancies in the figures of sanctioned post to those filled up in the Districts was mainly due to absorption of staff in the Line Department who were engaged before the year 2000.

10. Prime Minister Employment Guarantee Programme(PMEGP) :

The Director, KVIC informed the meeting that Aadhaar is insisted under PMEGP and on the selection of beneficiaries at the District the Project Director will chair the committee if the Deputy Commissioner is not available.

Action: All Project Directors, DRDAs.

11. State Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (SIRD&PR):

The Financial and Physical Progress was reported. It was suggested that the Local Administration Department has to take up the training of members of Village Councils . It would be beneficial if coordination is maintained by both the Departments in imparting training for the said purpose.

Action: Director,SIRD&PR/LAD.

12. Border Area Development Programme:

Under BADP, the State Matching Share amounting to Rs 511.11 lakhs for the F/Y 2016-17 has yet to be met and it was decided that the State Finance Department may allocate the amount and convey expenditure sanction accordingly.

Action: Finance Department.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks from the chair.
